
Through challenging the perceptions of the way most of us see and think about our lives and by setting levels of excellence within our community.







approaching the subject rather than denying it or pretending that this side of life doesn't exist.



The sandblasting gives my glass the appearance of a paper fold. Which plane is the actual shadow is not defined.




