Origin

'Waterworks' was the opening gambit of this Studio Arts unit. With the Fine Arts degree in 'teach out' mode, (with the suspension of intake and no first year program), the kinds of content familiar to 'Creative Strategies' was redirected into this second year core unit. As something of an experiment, we decided to see what would happen if the highly structured program of a 'Creative Strategies' unit (as a sequence of short project steps each requiring an outcome) were to carry over into second year, maintaining a high degree of productivity. The variety and quality of works produced confirmed the benefits of maintaining the momentum that Creative Strategies instilled in the first year of the program.


Premise

With Australia in the grip of drought and water scarcity, and with extensive media coverage addressing the worrying impact of global warming and climate change, it seemed appropriate to build a project around water. I prepared an extensive list of the properties and characteristics of water and its substantial metaphorical associations, all of which indicated the enormously significant part it plays in every individuals life, often in its ubiquity taken for granted. The vast array of possibilities in the way in which students could engage with this element provided substantial imaginative scope in creating a 'waterwork'.
